Course summary Each year focuses on a central theme. Y1: The human body in health and sickness. Y2: Integration of knowledge and skills. Y3: From paper to patient. There's a Dutch and an English-language bachelor.

Course description Each year of the bachelor's programme in Medicine focuses on a central theme. Your tutorials, skills trainings and lectures revolve around this theme. This will allow you to retain the information better. \* The first year deals with 'The human body in health and sickness'. In your tutorial group, you'll address topics such as 'circulation and breathing'. At the same time, your skills training will teach you resuscitation techniques. \* The second year is focused on 'Integration of knowledge and skills: on your way to practice'. You learn to think about diagnostics and treatments in a clinical manner. \* The third year is centred on the theme 'From paper to patient'. Instead of reading patient stories on paper, you get to meet real patients in outpatients clinics, whose cases form the basis of your studies. Your role in patient encounters begins with observation. Over time this gradually becomes more active and you are given more and more responsibility. The bachelor's in Medicine is a three-year programme. There's a Dutch and an English-taught bachelor.

Each year of the bachelor's programme in Medicine focuses on a central theme. The first year emphasises 'The human body in health and sickness', the second year focuses on 'Integration

subjects	of knowledge and skills' and the third year on 'From paper to patient'. Your tutorials, practical skills trainings and lectures (and outpatient clinic contacts in year 3) revolve around this theme. This will allow you to retain the information better.

## Admission

1. For the Dutch-taught bachelor: You have to be proficient in the Dutch language. A minimum level corresponding to NT2-II (Dutch as a second language) is required for this study programme. In case one or more of the conditions below apply to you, you automatically fulfill to the language requirement for this study programme:
  - \* Dutch is your native language. Native speaker: a) someone who has followed education in Dutch during 6 (or more) of his formative years (between 6 and 18 years old) / b) someone who has completed a study in Dutch language/literature (bachelor).
  - \* You have completed a HAVO or VWO high school programme in the Netherlands
  - \* You have completed a HBO or WO study programme in Dutch
  - \* You have completed a prior study programme outside of the Netherlands with Dutch as a second language
 List of study programmes outside the Netherlands with which candidates, based on Dutch as a second language, automatically meet the language requirement for a Dutch UM bachelor's or master's degree programme:
  - o Belgium, Flanders: Diploma of Secondary Education
  - o Belgium, Wallonia: Diploma of Secondary Education with Dutch as an exam subject.
  - o Germany: Zeugnis der allgemeinen Hochschulreife with Niederländisch as "Prüfungsfach" or "Leistungsfach"
  - o Suriname: VWO diploma or HBO (P) Diploma
  - o Netherlands Antilles and Aruba: VWO diploma or HAVO diploma followed by HBO (P)
  - o United Kingdom: GCE A-level or GCE AS-level in Dutch

 Note: If UM, however, has reasonable doubts about your language skills, UM can set additional requirements to demonstrate the required language level. For the English-taught bachelor / International Track in Medicine: Non-native speakers are required to demonstrate proof of English language proficiency. Native speakers and holders of an International Baccalaureate or European Baccalaureate-diploma, which programme, moreover, was fully completed in English, are exempted from evidence of proficiency in English. Also holders of a French Baccalaureate with American-English option are exempted from evidence of proficiency in English. Applicants with a grade of 7 or higher in the 5th or 6th year of Dutch VWO and applicants who obtained a 9 or higher in the 11th or 12th grade of the German Zeugnis der Allgemeine Hochschulreife are exempted from providing additional evidence of proficiency in English as well. All other applicants must present a TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) or IELTS (International English Language Testing System) score, or a CAE/CPE (Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English / Cambridge Certificate of proficiency in English). Applicants'/Your TOEFL score has to be at least: \* 575 and sufficient (at least 55) on each section in the paper-based version \* 232 and sufficient (at least 21) on each section in the computer-based version \* 90 and sufficient (at least 21) on each section in the internet-based version Applicants'/Your IELTS Overall Band Score must be at least 6.5 and all sections should be sufficient (so at least 6.0 on each section). Applicants'/Your CAE grade must be at least a B, whereas a C is sufficient for your CPE.

In short, the following rules apply:



- Tuition fees
- The "EU/EEA rate" is the regular fee for students from within the EU/EEA.
  - The "non-EU/EEA rate" is the rate for students from outside the EU/EEA.
  - The "institutional rate" is for all students who have already obtained a bachelor's or master's degree and who want to start a second programme leading to a degree at the same level or at a lower level.
  - Note that FT, PT and D stand for "full-time", "part-time" and "dual", respectively.
