Course summary The Master of Law and Economics was established in response to growing demands from international employers for multidisciplinary experts in competition, regulatory issues, and governance.

Course description Utrecht University's Master of Law and Economics was established in response to growing demands from international employers for multidisciplinary experts in competition, regulatory issues and governance. In the Master's programme in Law and Economics, you will focus on the economic and legal aspects of market regulation (in banking, energy, telecom, transport, health care, etc.), private equity, hedge funds, competition and competition policy, corporate governance and mergers. You will learn from an interdisciplinary team of legal experts and economists who enhance the challenging course content with both theory and real-world knowledge. The interdependence of economics and law is the prime focus of the programme. The programme has been organised in such way that students entering with a Bachelor of Law will be proceeding to an LLM degree, and students entering with a bachelor of economics (or business and economics) will be proceeding towards an MSc degree. As a consequence, the programme offers two tracks: one leading to an LLM and the other to an MSc.

Study The programme is divided into two semesters, running from September until January and from February till June. A semester is divided into two blocks. The academic year consists of six courses (worth 7.5 EC each) and a Master's thesis (worth 15 EC). A short break is taken



subjects	over Christmas, and a graduation ceremony is held in July or August. The entire programme is taught in English and you are expected to write all exams, essays, and your thesis in English.
Course objectives	Through its interdisciplinary approach focused on market regulation from both the legal and economic perspectives, this Master's programme will equip you with a completely new perspective and tool set. The curriculum will provide you with the academic knowledge, interdisciplinary understanding and research and analytical skills required for either a professional or academic career at the intersection of economics and law.

In short, the following rules apply:

- Tuition fees
- The "EU/EEA rate" is the regular fee for students from within the EU/EEA.
 - The "non-EU/EEA rate" is the rate for students from outside the EU/EEA.
 - The "institutional rate" is for all students who have already obtained a bachelor's or master's degree and who want to start a second programme leading to a degree at the same level or at a lower level.
 - Note that FT, PT and D stand for "full-time", "part-time" and "dual", respectively.
