Course summary In this three week program, students will explore housing, planning and policy issues in European cities as well as consider how these apply in other regions of the world.

Course description With a focus on real urban contexts, the course will examine subjects such as architecture and neighbourhood design, housing finance and policy, urban planning and sustainability, and the impact of household and demographic change. Amsterdam is one of Europe's most vibrant and attractive cities, providing a fascinating laboratory for the exploration and examination of urban issues.

With a focus on real urban places, set in both contemporary and historical contexts, the course will examine subjects such as architecture and neighborhood design, housing finance and policy, city planning and sustainability, and the impact of household and demographic change on urban lives and spaces.
