Alongside the origins, development and mechanics of the English language, you explore World Englishes (Australian, South African, Indian and Singaporean, to name a few) as well as how these are perceived and represented in literature and the media. Alongside the traditional canon of English literature, including works by William Shakespeare, Jane Austen, Charles Dickens and the Romantic poets, you examine the newest forms of contemporary English literature from around the globe, all studied within the appropriate political, social and historical contexts. The variety of options for elective courses, which may include study abroad and/or an internship, allows you to further customise the study to your interests.
