And of course, just as important is the age-old and crucial question of "Quis custodiet ipsos custodes?" or "Who watches the watchmen?" VU Amsterdam has a wealth of research expertise in the area of policing and security and offers a wide range of relevant Master's programmes on these topics, including Law and Politics of International Security, International Crimes and Criminology, Political Science: International Relations and Transnational Governance, and Bestuurskunde: Besturen van de Veiligheid (in Dutch only).
